I also started to judge unofficial all breed open shows in that time. To become an

official judge in Sweden you have to have breed for at least 10 years so it took a while until I decided to apply for this assignment.


My male Dahagin was very successful both at the shows and as a studmale. He mated very beautiful bitches and I kept some of his offspring. My foundation bitch Baklava's Tigris Min Dahaqin was born in 2002, she was a daughter to Dahaqin and I took my first litter from her in 2006. Up until now I have breed 7 litter and the 8th will be born now in February 2023. In those litters I have got several national and international champions as well as 4 SBIS winners and 1 World Winner but also several Lure-coursing champions. Today I have 4 salukis at home, 3 males and 1 bitch. I also co own 3 bitches from 2 different litters that I perhaps will use for breeding this year or following years-

In 2016 in become an FCI judge. I am for now authorized to judge all breeds in FCI Group 10 and Pharaohounds, Podenco Ibicenco and Podengo in group 5.

I have judge in Sweden, Denmark, Holland, Finland, Norway, Slovenia, Switzerland Australia and USA

I have travelled a lot and visit shows all over the world. I visit the USA National in Lexington in 1999 and in 2006 I visited the show in Pleasanton, San Francisco and last year I judge that show. I been three times in Australia at saluki shows before judging there in 2019 and visiting Crufts in England several times. I have competed with my salukis in lots of countries in Europe.

Looking forward so much to the assignments and know it will be a wonderful journey.

Dr McEvoy's family have always had dogs, Irish Dogs. First were the Irish Terriers, then Irish Setters, followed by the Kerry Blue (his first attendance at a show was with his grandfather's Kerry Blue, in 1959) and finally Irish Wolfhounds.

When he and his wife married, they enjoyed life with the Setters, but in 1972 together, they acquired their first Irish Wolfhound, an import from the Erindale Kennels (UK). This was the start of a wonderful journey, during which time they have imported further dogs, mainly from the famous Eaglescrag kennel, exported dogs to many countries; won nearly 40 Specialty Best in Show (and as many runner-up awards) with the Irish Wolfhounds; and most of all, enjoyed the dogs as part of their family.

Dr McEvoy began judging in the Hound Group in 1986 and has judged since then in all around Australia; and overseas. He has judged in New Zealand, Canada, United States, Britain, Ireland, Italy, Denmark, Germany, Thailand, and Sweden. He is the Hound Group Coordinator for the Judges training program, Deputy Coordinator for the Judges' training program in SA, President of the Adelaide Kennel Club and Chairman of the Dog Section for the Royal Adelaide Show.

Sei-ichiro was raised with dogs. In 1993, he became involved with Italian Greyhounds and fell in love with them.

In 1994, Sei-ichiro and his parents co founded Flash Shower Italian Greyhounds in Tokyo, Japan. Flash Shower Italian Greyhounds has developed trusting relationships and camaraderie with prestigious overseas breeders in the USA, Australia, Finland and other places, from whom they acquire mating partners for their dogs. Sei ichiro and his parents are committed to breeding quality Italian Greyhounds.

By 2015, the dogs bred and owned by Flash Shower had won Pedigree Awards for nineteen consecutive years.

In her glory years, FCI JKC CH Flash Shower JP Miss Perfect, among them, was awarded Best in Show more than twenty times. She also placed fifth among JKC AII Breeds.

Sei- ichiro began showing dogs as an owner handler when he was a college student. He has showed and finished with multiple Best in Shows. He has also finished with multiple Group Placements at the FCI Asia International Dog Show, among still other accolades received during his owner handler career.

At present, Sei-ichiro is certified to judge All Breeds recognized by the JKC/FCI. He has judged at dog shows in Japan, Poland, Finland, Brazil, Colombia, Argentina, Vietnam, Thailand, France, Italy, Russia, Peru, Lithuania, Croatia, Estonia, Hungary, Gibraltar, New Zealand, Australia, Canada and USA including Westminster Kennel Club Show 2021 and FCI World Dog Show 2022-

Sei-ichiro is the president of The JKC Southern Tokyo Italian Greyhound Club which is the only Italian Greyhound Specialty Club in Asia. He is also a member of The Italian Greyhound Club of America.

Sei-ichiro is a licensed real estate broker and runs his own business besides being the co founder of Flash Shower Italian Greyhounds. He continues his joyful life with his dogs.





My adventure with cynology began in 1993, but the dogs have been with me at home since I was a child. Borzois have been an integral part of my life for 29 years now. But it was even earlier when I had decided that one day I would live with a borzoi. As a young boy I saw a photo of one in a book. Now I wouldn't give him more than "very good" on the ring but at the time I was completely enchanted, I set my mind on this breed and there was no turning back. However, life in the

countryside, in a block of flats, in communist Poland, didn't let my dreams come true for many long years. About 10 years later I began to visit dog shows in Poland and I had a chance to see a borzoi live for the very first time in my life. Their movement, elegance and, most importantly, their temperament confirmed what I had learnt only from books and had been subconsciously predicting for so long. Borzoi is a dog for me. I didn't wait long to buy a first one. It was on 1994, but I had to wait 8 years for my first litter.

Since then I've had puppies quite regularly. Last litter with number 13 was born on 2013. Together they are 80 borzois born under my kennel name "Bilans". Some of them was Nationals and International champions. I have at the moment still 2 borzois at home. And unfortunately for some emotional reasons I decide not breeding my beloved breed any more.

Since 2008 I am co-owner and now owner of whippets under prefix "Synergy". Now I can tell my second love after my borzois. They are totally different but smaller and I was thinking about one smaller breed at home. After this last years I can tell that it was good decision. I have at the moment 14 Whippets. To date, 145 puppies in 21 litters have been born under the name Synergy. In the pedigrees for the most part are english lines, the same what I prefer with borzois. Many of them are Champions and International Champions. And although I really like exhibitions as a form of spending free time and the

opportunity to compare my dogs with others, the most important thing for me is a peaceful and safe life for both my dogs and the dogs I have brought to life.

I made my debut as a judge in 2008. When judging sighthounds I'm looking for an overall balance and sound, smooth and covering gait. During my journey through life as a judge, I had the pleasure of judging at many specialized shows dedicated to the breeds I breed. I believe that this is a special distinction for a breeder. I have already judged in Poland, Germany, Czech Republic, Switzerland, Denmark, Sweden, Finland and Italy. Now I am also a judge for whole group V and VIII, part of group IX, Junior Handling and Not Recognized by FCI Breeds.

The invitation to judge in Austria is very valuable and very important to me, especially that it will be judging at such a prestigious show. This is my first invitation to judging in Austria. I believe that each breeder who is a judge highly appreciates such opportunities. I would like to express my gratitude to the Committee for inviting me and I'm looking forward to see many truly beautiful dogs and to participate in a very special event along with other dogs friends.
